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TERMS OF REFERENCE

MICT/SETA/FI/003/2021: APPOINTMENT OF A SERVICE PROVIDER FOR PROVISION OF FORENSIC INVESTIGATIONS.



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1. BACKGROUND

The Media, Information and Communication Technology Sector Education ("MICT SETA") is a statutory body established through the Skills Development Act of 1998 to enable its stakeholders to advance the national and global position of the Advertising, Electronic Media and Film, Electronics, Information Technology and Telecommunications sectors in the Large, Medium, Small levy paying and non-levy paying companies in the sector.

The MICT SETA (SETA) has an approved policy on Discretionary Grants (DG) with clearly stipulated guidelines on how allocations should be made to respective stakeholders, these guidelines act as a blue print in how the SETA should award Service Level agreements (SLAs) to qualifying service providers. The aim of this forensic project will be to assess if there are inconsistencies in the process of awarding SLAs, which ultimately contradict the principles of fairness, openness and transparency promoted by the Discretionary Grants Policy. Through this exercise, the SETA will expect a forensic report as the outcome of the project, which will highlight details of the investigation and findings.

2. TERMS OF REFERENCE (SCOPE OF WORK TO BE CONDUCTED)

2.1 The Forensic services will include the following, but not limited to:

- 2.1.1. To perform an in depth investigation and review into the processes that were followed in selecting stakeholders, during the awarding of Discretionary Grants SLAs offered by the SETA, for the period starting 01 April 2019 to 31 March 2021, in compliance with the approved DG policy.
- 2.1.2. To investigate whether the services specified in the SLAs entered into for the period 01 April 2019 to 31 March 2021 were actually delivered by the contracted stakeholders.
- 2.1.3. To determine if any of the expenditure allocated to the stakeholders constitute irregular, unauthorised, fruitless and/or wasteful expenditure in terms of all applicable legislation.
- 2.1.4. To prepare a detailed report on the review and investigation, the report should highlight the cause, consequence, responsible person in law and make relevant recommendations and remedial actions that the SETA can adopt.
- 2.1.5. Conduct forensic investigations on all issued SLAs, to investigate and instances of fraud and corruption on Discretionary Grants (DGs) for the period 01 April 2019 to 31 March 2021
- 2.1.6. Analyse any other related reports not limited to vetting, minutes etc. and other documents from the SETA to identify possible fraud and corruption, risks and any other incidents of irregularities. Amongst others this includes, instances where one individual was funded multiple times using different company names (double dipping);
- 2.1.7. Recommend and support disciplinary actions relating to incidents of fraud and corruption against any identified persons, including testifying during disciplinary proceedings (this includes periods beyond the end of the forensic company's term of contract), should the need arise;



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- 2.1.8. If there are findings of criminal acts, the service provider must make recommendations to the relevant law enforcement agency or other appropriate agencies/bodies, recommend for criminal proceedings and give expert testimony against any service providers and other parties, employees involved in fraud and corruption incidents at the SETA;
- 2.2.9. Whether the SETA suffered financial and/or any other losses as a result of the transactions, related to the scope of this investigation, and if so to what extent.
- 2.2.10. Conduct value for money assessment to determine the extent at which the SETA has derived benefit from the transactions.
- 2.2.11. Assess any breakdown in the designed internal controls that were in place, the impact thereof, and provide recommendations to prevent these control weaknesses in the future.
- 2.2.12. Review the transactions to determine the legal/contractual obligations which SETA has and the extent thereof if the transactions gave to a legal contractual obligation, in terms of the issued SLAs.
- 2.2.13. Transactions identified as irregular expenditure should be covered in this project in accordance with Irregular Expenditure Framework issued by National Treasury. This will include identifying the specific officials involved.
- 2.1.14. Perform a value for money assessment to identify unauthorized, irregular, fruitless and/or wasteful expenditure.
- 2.1.15. A determination and identification of sub-contracting companies that have more than one SLA with the SETA.
- 2.1.16. To establish how funds were flowing from the stakeholders that were paid and if to particular parties, to provide clarity on such. transactions
- 2.1.17. To establish the total amount involved in the suspected irregular, unauthorised, and fruitless and wasteful contracts.
- 2.2.18. Refer criminal allegations of fraud and corruption to the relevant law enforcement agency or other appropriate agencies/bodies; and
- 2.1.19. Initiate and support criminal proceedings and give expert testimony against any service providers and other parties, employees involved in fraud and corruption incidents at the SETA;

3. PROJECT OUTPUTS

3.1. The main project outputs will essentially be:

To provide a final project investigation report, amongst others, with clear recommendations to be issued to the MICT SETA within three (3) months of appointment to this contract.



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4. EVALUATION CRITERIA

Bids received will be evaluated against the following set evaluation criteria.

4.1. PRE-QUALIFICATION CRITERIA PRE-QUALIFICATION CRITERIA (Regulation 4)-PPPFA

a. Bidder shall have a minimum BBBEE status of level 2 or better.

Proof of compliance

Bidder must submit a valid proof of BBBEE status (BBBEE verification certificate issued by a SANAS accredited agency verification agency or CIPC B-BBEE certificate or B-BBEE affidavit duly sworn and commissioned).

4.2. FUNCTIONAL CRITERIA

4.2.1. Technical Evaluation

Only bidders that have met the set pre-qualification criteria will be considered for functionality evaluation. Bids submitted will be evaluated on technically functionality out of a maximum of **100 points.** A threshold of **70** out of the **100 points** has been set.

Only bidders that have met or exceeded the qualification threshold on technical functionality of 70 points will qualify for further evaluation on Price and B-BBEE according to the 80/20 preference point system in terms of the PPPFA Regulations 2017, where 80 points will be for Price and 20 points will be for B-BBEE status level of contribution.
