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TERMS OF REFERENCE

PROVISION FOR JOB EVALUATION, SALARY BENCHMARKING WHICH REVIEW OF ORGANIZATIONAL STRUCTURE AND SKILLS AUDIT SERVICES.



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1. BACKGROUND

Media, Information and Communication Technology Sector Education ("MICT SETA") is a statutory body established through the Skills Development Act of 1998 to enable its stakeholders to advance the national and global position of the Advertising, Electronic Media and Film, Electronics, Information Technology and Telecommunications sectors in the Large, Medium, Small levy paying and non-levy paying companies in the sector.

The objective of this RFQ is to appoint a competent service provider to evaluate and grade all (72-80) positions within MICT SETA as well as conduct and provide a benchmark for appropriate salary packages and salary scales for the full-time employee roles within MICT SETA. The current three (3) year validity of evaluation results was conducted in 2018 and has elapsed in 2021. The service provider will also be required to conduct a skills audit on x20-25 Managers and Senior Managers of MICT SETA. Conduct a review of the current organizational structure and recommend a structure that is fit for purpose.

2. TERMS OF REFERENCE

2.1 Type of job evaluation and benchmark

- Recommend a suitable grading system for the MICT SETA.
- Do a comparison across at least three (3) grading systems for presentation; e.g. Patterson, Hay and Peromes grading.
- Ensure the grading is aligned or compatible with MICT SETA's career progression.
- Compare, through a sample, the old job grades with the new job grades.
- It would be an external benchmark to compare internal results with external independent private and public organisations that require similar skills, knowledge and experience to that required by MICT SETA, as well as to identify industry-related remuneration and pay structure (grades) for all positions within MICT SETA.
- A pay system should be proposed based on a systematic assessment of the internal and external
 importance and worth of the job. The pay structure should establish and set boundaries on pay
 grades based on the results of the job evaluation and market survey to allow for movement within
 a pay structure based on duration/seniority or merit of the individual. Correct salary cap in
 instances where they occurred.
- The evaluation exercise is between 72 to 80 positions within MICT SETA.

2.2 Benchmark/ job evaluation criteria and scope

- The proposed process and/or methodology should satisfy the goals of the exercise and include companies that utilize skills, knowledge and experience similar to MICT SETA.
- The evaluation exercise must include a minimum of six (6) SETAs and other public entities or SOEs which are in competition with MICT SETA for skills. Another important consideration is staff retention for MICT SETA.



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- The salary benchmarking must include a minimum of six (6) SETAs and other public entities or SOEs. It will be important for the benchmarking outcome.
- The benchmark should ensure statistical correctness and include a sample size in respect of each position. When reporting on salary data the following definitions should be used, unless otherwise recommended by the service provider:
- Total guaranteed package is the total annual guaranteed cost to company for employing an employee. This includes the total annual salary and non-cash fringe benefits (e.g. pension or provident fund, medical aid contributions, risk benefits etc.);
- Total remuneration refers to the total all-inclusive annual cost to company for employing an employee. This cost includes the basic salary and guaranteed benefits.
- The service provider would be required to familiarize oneself with MICT SETA's structures, roles, responsibilities and key performance areas of permanent employees and internships, and conduct an analysis of similar positions in the market.
- Conduct a salary benchmarking exercise to determine MICT SETA's position in the market in respect of its current remuneration scales. The benchmark should propose a set of market related pay scales for MICT SETA.
- The service provider will be required to present to MICT SETA employees, MANCO, Board sub-committees, EXCO and the Board on the intended methodology, inform sources and present frequent updates on the critical stages of the project to the indicated stakeholders.
- The service provider will further be required to present results of the project to MICT SETA employees, MANCO, Board sub-committees, EXCO and the Board.
- Further to the above, MICT SETA requires access to a remuneration benchmarking system with real time reporting, real data forecasting capabilities for future use internally.
- The service provider will also be required to conduct a skills audit between 20 to 25 Managers and Senior Managers of MICT SETA. Conduct a review of the current organizational structure and recommend a structure that is fit for purpose.

2.3 Competency and knowledge, skills and abilities required:

- Preference will be given to professionals/ companies that will be able to demonstrate prior experience of similar projects successfully implemented.
- Proof of experience should be submitted with responses to the bid invitation.
- Ability to design and implement output-driven reward solutions.
- Have the capacity and resources to meet tight deadlines and be available to commence immediately.

2.4 Target Market

 The information will be used by Human Resources professionals within MICT SETA for recruitment and retention purposes.



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BID EVALUATION CRITERIA

3. EVALUATION CRITERIA

Bids received will be evaluated against the following set evaluation criteria.

3.1. PRE-QUALIFICATION CRITERIA (Regulation 4)

a) Bidder shall have a minimum BBBEE status of level 3 or better.

Proof of compliance

Bidder must submit a valid proof of BBBEE status (BBBEE verification certificate issued by a SANAS accredited agency verification agency or CIPC B-BBEE certificate or B-BBEE affidavit duly sworn and commissioned).

Bidders please take note:

The duly sworn and commissioned BBBEE affidavits must be based on the Audited Financial Statements/Financial Statements and other information available on the latest financial year-end. Kindly contact the DTI for more information with regards to latest financial year end.e.g 28 February 2021.

Note: Bidders that do not meet the requirements of set pre-qualification criteria will be eliminated from further evaluation process.

3.2. FUNCTIONAL CRITERIA

Technical Evaluation

Only bidders that have met the set pre-qualification and mandatory criteria will be considered for functionality evaluation.

Bids submitted will be evaluated on technically functionality out of a maximum of **100 points**. A threshold of **70** out of the **100 points** has been set.

Note: All bidders achieving less than the set threshold will be declared non-responsive. Assessment of evaluation of the functional/ technical criteria will be based on the table below:

6.4. PREFERENCE POINT SYSTEM

- a. The bidder obtaining the highest number of total points will be awarded the contract unless objective criteria justify the award to another bidder.
- b. In the event that two or more tenderers have scored equal total points, the successful tenderer must be the one that scored the highest points for B-BBEE.
- c. If two or more tenderers have equal points, including equal preference points for B-BBEE, the successful tenderer must be the one scoring the highest score for functionality, if functionality is part of the evaluation process.
- d. In the event that two or more tenderers are equal in all respects, the award must be decided by the drawing of lots

6.4.1. POINTS AWARDED FOR PRICE

Maximum 80 points for price will be allocated as per paragraph 3.1 of Preferential Procurement Regulations 2011, refer to Preferential Procurement Claim form on **SBD 6.1**.

4.4.2 POINTS AWARDED FOR B-BBEE

Maximum 20 points for B-BBEE will be allocated as per paragraph 4.1 of Preferential Procurement Regulations 2011, refer to Preferential Procurement Claim form on **SBD 6.1**.

- a. Bidders who qualify as EME's and QSE's in terms of the B-BBEE Act must submit a Sworn affidavit. Misrepresentation of information, constitutes a criminal offence.
- b. Bidders other than EME's or QSE's must submit their original and valid B-BBEE status level verification certificate or a certified copy thereof, substantiating their B-BBEE rating issued by SANAS.
- c. A trust, consortium or joint venture will qualify for points for their B-BBEE status level as a legal entity, provided that the entity submits their B-BBEE status level certificate.
- d. A trust, consortium or joint venture will qualify for points for their B-BBEE status level as an unincorporated entity, provided that the entity submits their consolidated B-BBEE scorecard as if they were a group structure and that such a consolidated B-BBEE scorecard is prepared for every separate bid.
- e. Tertiary institutions and public entities will be required to submit their B-BBEE status level certificates in terms of the specialized scorecard contained in the B-BBEE Codes of Good Practice.
- f. A Bidder will not be awarded points for B-BBEE status level if it is indicated in the bid documents that such a bidder intends sub-contracting more than 25% of the value of the contract to any other enterprise that does not qualify for at least the points that such a bidder qualifies for, unless the intended Sub-contractor is an EME that has the capacity and the ability to execute the sub-contract.
- g. A Bidder awarded a contract may not sub-contract more than 25% of the value of the contract to any other enterprise that does not have equal or higher B-BBEE status level than the person concerned, unless the contract is sub-contracted to an EME that has the capacity and the ability to execute the sub-contract.
