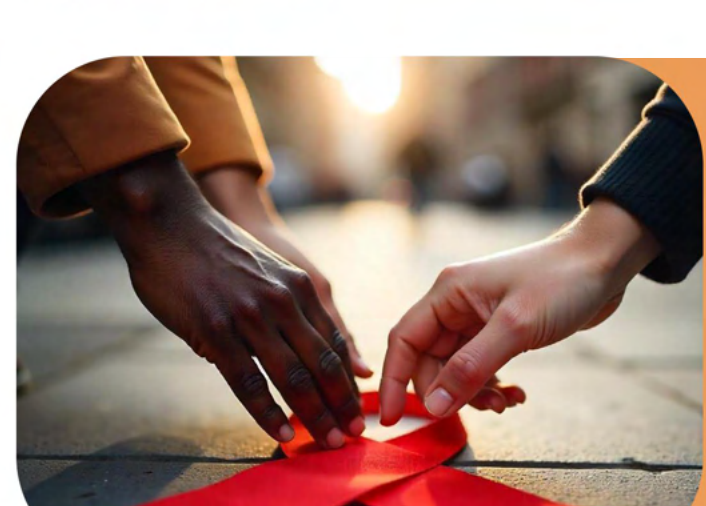

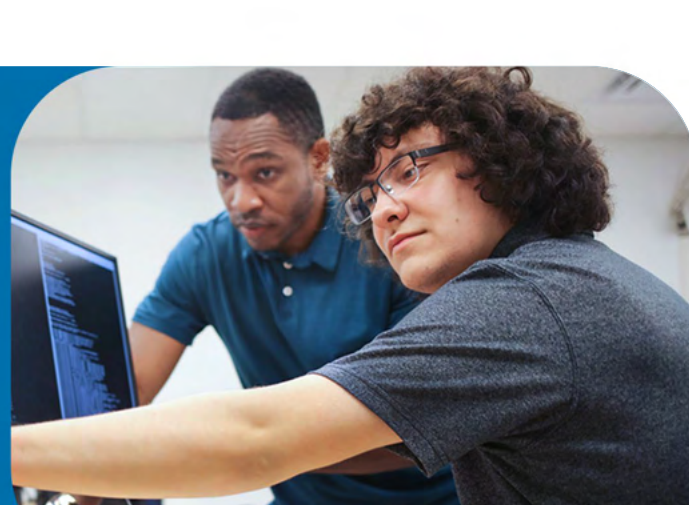

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02 MICT SETA celebrates Clean Audit in two consecutive years

The MICT SETA's Annual General Meeting (AGM), convened on 8 November 2024, was a grand gathering of industry leaders and stakeholders where our organisation's achievements in governance, skills development, and strategic growth across advertising, film and electronic media, electronics, information technology, and telecommunications sectors were highlighted.

CFO Mthenjwa Mseleku provided valuable insights into the MICT SETA's financial performance, while the Auditor-General of South Africa (AGSA) confirmed a clean audit outcome for the second consecutive year.

On the agenda were also MICT SETA's strategic initiatives that are geared towards advancing digital transformation and skills training to meet the ever-growing demands of the Fourth Industrial Revolution (4IR). MICT SETA's new web-based Learner Management System (LMS), a digital innovation aimed at streamlining governance, fostering collaboration, and integrating essential

processes like learning programmes, grant disbursements, and quality assurance, was highlighted as a key component in promoting a shared services model.

"Through initiatives like the LMS, we are not only enhancing operational efficiency but also advancing our mission to massively scale digital skills. Introducing The new Innovative ETQA LMS Module

The MICT SETA recently hosted a series of hybrid national rollout sessions for the ETQA Learner Management System (LMS) Module. Kicking off in Mpumalanga, the primary goal of the roadshows were to introduce and demonstrate the new ETQA LMS module, while also providing updates on legislative and SETA-related matters.

The LMS is a new, web-based innovation designed to integrate essential processes, including learning programmes, grant disbursements, and quality assurance. This streamlines governance and fosters collaboration between the SETA and its stakeholders. The training was facilitated by the ETQA Division along with the Tshwane University of Technology who as an MICT Research developed the system in collaboration with MICT SETA Systems Developer, Mr Timothy Chuene. To ensure an interactive learning experience, all participants were required to bring their laptops or tablets to access the system.

These roadshows took place across all nine provinces, with two sessions held in Gauteng. Furthermore, the sessions offered a valuable opportunity to ensure that all stakeholders were aligned and fully equipped to effectively implement and benefit from this innovative system. The sessions empowered all MICT SETA Skills Development Providers (SPs) and Education Training and Development Practitioners (ETD Practitioners) on navigating the system. The feedback provided indicated how eager stakeholders were to have a centralised system for MICT related functions, this was furthermore demonstrated by the uptake on the utilisation of the system.





05 MICT SETA showcases how tourism and technology can merge to create new opportunities

Hosted at the New Peter Mokaba Stadium in Limpopo Province, the 2024 National Tourism Careers Expo (NTCE) was aimed at inspiring Grade 9 to 12 learners, TVET and university students, as well as unemployed graduates.

Themed 'Tourism and Peace: 30 years of connecting people to places and cultures', the expo aimed to further inspire and uplift young people to think outside the box and pursue sustainable livelihoods in tourism through innovation, entrepreneurship and government led programmes.

In partnership with Forge Academy, the MICT SETA showcased in the 'Digital and Artificial Intelligence (AI) corner' to inspire young people to explore careers in 4IR-related fields, which can play a significant role in the tourism and hospitality sectors. This was done through experiential learning using robotics and virtual reality to create interest in 4IR.

Furthermore, learners were introduced to exciting career opportunities that are largely driven by technological advancements such as digital tours, and innovative tourism solutions that are enhancing traveler experiences.

Some notable activities at the expo included motivational talks by leading local sector entrepreneurs and personalities, tourism educator seminars, exhibitions by local tourism products and related services – all aimed at sharing information with educators and learners on the diverse careers available in the sector.

The NTCE was a successful collaborative effort between The Department of Tourism (DT), The Culture, Arts, Tourism, Hospitality & Sport Sector Education and Training Authority (CATHSSETA) and the Limpopo Department of Economic Development, Environment and Tourism (LEDET), and its marketing agency the Limpopo Tourism Agency (LTA).

VUT & MICT SETA Host Groundbreaking 4IR Symposium

The MICT SETA, in partnership with the Vaal University of Technology (VUT), successfully hosted the inaugural Fourth Industrial Revolution (4IR) Research Symposium and Expo from 25 to 26 October 2024. Diving deep into 4IR opportunities and challenges, this event proved to be an important milestone in South Africa's research landscape.

Themed 'Impact of Generative Artificial Intelligence (AI) on Future Skills,' the symposium focused on how AI could potentially shape the workforce of the future – as well as broadening access to cutting-edge research and accelerating innovations that boost productivity and operational efficiency across various sectors.

The line-up of distinguished speakers included Dr Simphiwe Nelana, Deputy Vice-Chancellor for Research, Innovation, Commercialisation and Internationalisation at VUT; Professor Mandlakhe Radebe, Chairperson of VUT Council; Natalie Nelson, Acting CEO of MICT SETA; Simphiwe Thobela, Chairperson of the MICT SETA Board; Professor Owolawi Pius, Research Chair at the Tshwane University of Technology (TUT); and other prominent Research Chairs from leading universities.

In his opening speech, Dr Simphiwe Nelana set a collaborative tone for the event by inviting attendees to engage with his office on matters related to research and innovation. Professor Mandlakhe Radebe commended the launch of the 4IR Research Chair and symposium, emphasising its alignment with VUT's 2033+ strategic plan. He noted that AI's rapid integration into daily life is reshaping the global workforce and called for a focus on preparing South Africans for highly skilled occupations that can adapt to change.

Natalie Nelson, Acting CEO of MICT SETA, delved into the origins of the MICT Research Chairs projects, urging attendees to prepare for the complexities of the 4IR era and to capitalise on emerging opportunities.

In his keynote address, Chairperson of the MICT SETA Board Simphiwe Thobela stressed the importance of positioning South Africa as a global competitor in 4IR. He advocated for hackathons and symposiums to cultivate world-class skills and cutting-edge trends, noting that research chairs are pivotal in integrating technology and research into educational experiences.

The second day of the symposium featured presentations on various topics including transformer-based language models, the impact of generative artificial intelligence (AI) on future skills, enablers of digital innovation, and support for technology development and commercialisation.

A big highlight of the symposium was a panel discussion led by Professor Owolawi Pius, joined by Professor Tranos Zuva, VUT Research Chair, Professor Oludayo Olungbara, Durban University of Technology Research Chair, Joseph Ndaba, 4IR Commissioner at the Presidential Commission and Dr Andile Ngcaba, Chairperson of Solcon Capital. The panel explored pressing ethical challenges associated with generative AI, significant advancements positioned to influence the future job market, the coexistence of AI and humans, and strategies for businesses to prepare their workforce for this transformative shift.

The ribbon-cutting ceremony at the end of the MICT SETA-VUT 4IR Research Chair not only marked the official launch of the symposium, but also represented the establishment of new collaborations and a shared commitment to advancing 4IR technologies through innovative research and partnerships.

South Africa's entanglement with HIV/AIDS - Finally breaking free!

It was in 1983 when virologists at the Institut Pasteur discovered Human immunodeficiency virus (HIV), a virus that causes Acquired immunodeficiency virus (AIDS), the most advanced stage of the disease. 40 years later, its prevalence in South Africa is estimated at 12.7 percent, with 8 million people infected.

This makes South Africa the country with the highest number of HIV-infected people. However, since 2004, AIDS-related deaths have decreased by 69 percent while new infections started declining by a whopping 60 percent from 1995.

Testing and Treatment

In 2013, the Joint United Nations Programme on HIV/AIDS (UNAIDS) established the 90-90-90 rule, meaning 90 percent of people diagnosed, 90 percent of those initiated on Antiretroviral therapy (ART), and at least 90 percent of those should achieve viral suppression. This rule has greatly impacted the stats of people receiving ART, aged 15 and older. However, estimates show that 1 in 4 people living with HIV are not on treatment. This could be due to numerous reasons, such as traditional beliefs, accessibility, stigmatisation and, to a certain extent, lack of family support and proper counselling by clinicians.

Wellness First

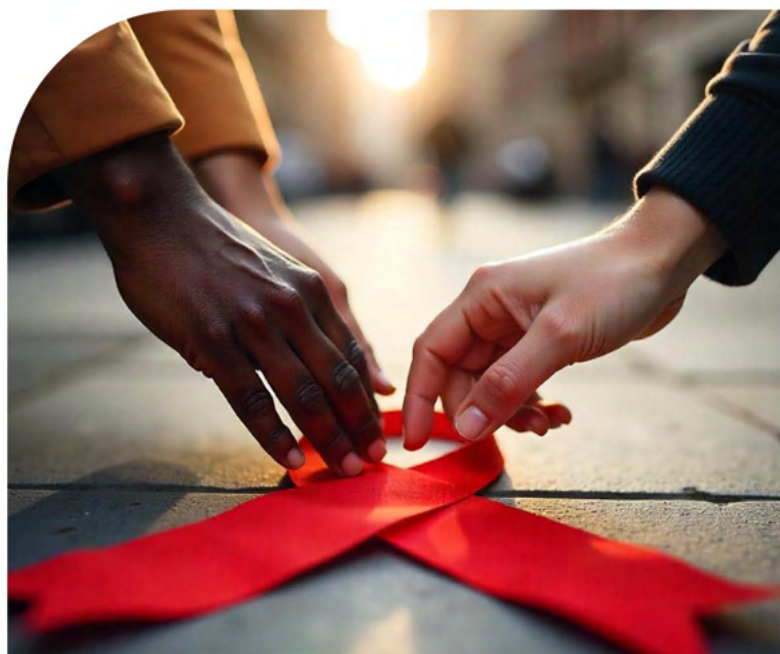
The introduction of a fixed-dose combination (FDC) tablet ensured more convenience and easy compliance with fewer to none untoward reactions, as compared to the previous complex treatment regimen. Lifestyle changes while on HIV treatment are imperative.

This includes establishing a healthy diet, exercising, practising safe sex, as well as regular STI and TB screenings to prevent opportunistic infections. In 2024, pre-exposure prophylaxis (PreP) coverage increased in sexually active individuals.

An estimated 1.3 million people in SA are using PreP. This is only available as a pill in the public sector, with the injectable version soon to be made available.

Keeping The Hope

Support groups, unconditional love from family and friends are integral to the health journeys of people living with HIV/Aids. Experience has shown me that the love and support of family lessens the burden of the diagnosis – and plays a huge role in encouraging patients to live responsibly.



For those who are HIV negative, regular testing, access to PreP and PeP will help maintain your negative status. Moreover, creating non-judgemental, safe environments won't only help us break free from our long-standing entanglement with HIV, but will help us create an HIV-free future for SA.

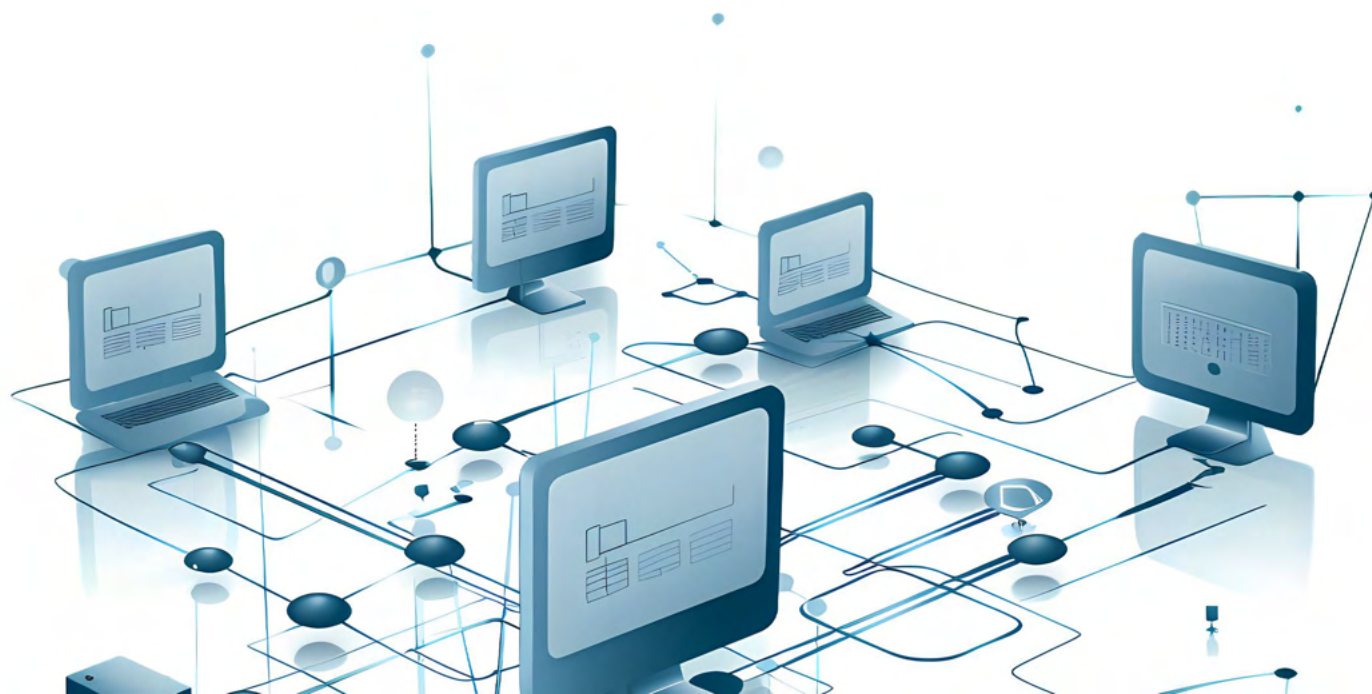
2025/2026 WSPs and ATRs Submission Window is Now Open
